## Twenty-nine Gospel Preachers Graduate From MSOP

wo years ago, these faithful men began a journey, the first leg of which will end on June 17, 2007, when they graduate from the Memphis School of Preaching. Although the good Forest Hill elders oversee this work, the work of the Memphis School of Preaching is in many hours in study. They have investigated the Scriptures in depth, book by book, and verse by verse. They have memorized about ways a brotherhood work! One reason the name "Memphis School of Preaching" originally was chosen, was to give honor, fifteen hundred Bible verses, and have written dozens of papers and sermons. Graduates of MSOP have made difficult choices, leaving the raising of the final \$1.5 million. ## **ALMOST FIFTY STUDENTS ENROLLED SO FAR**

As of the middle of May (when this is being written), nearly fifty students are enrolled for the 2007-2008 school year. We expect others to be admitted before the Fall Quarter which begins August 20, as well as even more who will begin their studies in January.

In addition to these preacher students, classes for the student wives, and the third-year program add another forty, or fifty (or more) students. Thus, the Memphis School of Preaching is actually teaching around a hundred students, or more,

The intensive, collegiate level program of MSOP requires preacher students to be in class six hours a day and to study six hours at night. Because of this workload, students are not allowed to hold secular jobs while at MSOP. Therefore, they depend upon the financial support of their brethren, both individuals and churches, for their living expenses while here

MSOP does not charge tuition, nor are there any fees; however, students still have to have shelter, food, clothing, transportion, and insurance, and buy their books, and so on. The Forest Hill congregation provides more than \$500,000 per year for faculty, staff, facilities, equipment, and such related expenses.

How do we help students receive support? We rely upon scholarships and the continuing financial support of generous, compassionate brethren to take care of the basic living expenses of our preacher students.

## YOUR SUPPORT IS VERY MUCH NEEDED

Sadly, sometimes these men, who have left homes, jobs, and financial security, in order to dedicate their lives to preaching the gospel, are in real, even desperate, need. Some have to do without the most basic needs because they do not have the money to pay for them--yet, they do not quit. Just this week, a student came to me lamenting the fact that he might have to drop out of school because of lack of support. He has been living on around \$300 a month for almost a year. We have been helping, as we can, but he must have more support. Especially is this lack of support troubling when wives and children are in need.

Are these faithful, dedicated men not worthy of our support? Since they have given so much, can we not help them by sharing the load? What can we do?

Send your support for these deserving preacher students to MSOP. One time contributions help, and monthly support is needed. If we all do what we can, we can help these men prepare themselves for a lifetime of faithful service to God.
