Gatlinburg, TN Benevolence Update

Rod Rutherford (1974) writes, "In the fires which engulfed the Great Smoky Mountain National Park and burned many residences and businesses in and around Gatlinburg in late November and early December, our church building was burned to the ground. We lost all our teaching supplies, songbooks, Bibles, church library, etc. Three homeowners (five families affected) in the congregation also lost their homes and everything they had. Brethren have voluntarily and spontaneously responded in a wonderful way to our needs. We have been given many of the basic things needed and contributions have come in from at least 38 states and Australia, Canada, Great Britain and New Zealand. We have been able to help the five church families get re-established in new homes. We have also been able to help a dozen or more families in the community who also lost their homes. We have enough funds on hand, along with our insurance payment, to rebuild our building without incurring debt. We have begun the work of rebuilding. We had so many relief supplies given that we could not give them all away so we are giving them to brotherhood children's homes. We are no longer in need of financial help or other assistance. [We give glory to God for this wonderful news! Mike]. We are deeply grateful to our generous and benevolent brotherhood. We have been blessed to lease a place to meet until we can get into our new facility which we anticipate may take as long as a year. We are meeting at 109 West Ogle Drive. It is half a block off highway 321 in Gatlinburg. Our website at www.gatlinburgchurchofchrist.com has detailed directions and times of services. We hope visitors to the Smokies will plan to worship with us while in our area . . . I appreciate your good work in keeping all the alumni informed of the school and of what is happening with all of us."

We worked along side several members from the Grecia congregation and other Costa Rican brethren who came in to help the brethren in Grecia. It was great seeing congregations working together. Many of the young people, taking the time out during their school break, worked hard knocking doors and inviting people to come out to the nightly meetings. The building was full to capacity almost every night. The national religion of Costa Rica is Roman Catholicism. While many are steeped in this religious tradition, we have found most of the Costa Rican people to be respectful, friendly, and open to Bible study. While there, our team conducted sixty-nine studies, and left forty-four additional contacts for future study. The responses thus far from the campaign included three baptisms, two restorations, and one lady who requested prayer. This will have been my fifth trip into Costa Rica. I am thankful to my home congregation here in Chesapeake, VA for supplying the expense support and the time to be away to accomplish this good work. To God be the glory and thanks to Him for giving the increase."

LECTURESHIP CHILDCARE INFORMATION

The MSOP student wives are pleased to provide classes and childcare for children 0-5 years from 9:00-11:50 a.m. and 1:30-4:15 p.m., during the lectureship. Due to space and staff restrictions, we will not offer classes for children over the age of 5 years old. We want this time to be edifying and educational for you and your children. We recognize that the transition for your child can be challenging. We ask that you help us in making the transition easier by observing the following requirements. These guidelines have been implemented to improve the safety, comfort, and quality of classroom time for your child.

Register: All parents are required to register their children and complete an information sheet prior to dropping off children. This will assist the teachers in becoming acquainted with your child and allow you to note any special needs and provide information on how best to comfort them. *Please fill out a registration form on the school web site at www.msop.org for each child.* This will help greatly in our planning.

Sick Child: If your child is sick, running a fever, vomiting, etc., please do not bring him/her to class. They must be free of fever for 24 hours before bringing them to class. Your consideration in this matter is appreciated.

Child Safety: While there have been no problems in the past, we want to continue to keep your child safe. Parents or another adult designee should be prepared to show photo ID if requested. Children will not be permitted to leave with anyone under 18 years of age. This may seem inconvenient; however our interest is in the safety of your child.

Child Drop-off: Each child is required to be signed IN and OUT each time you bring in or pick up your child. The registration desk also serves as the drop-off location. To avoid classroom disruption, we ask that parents come to the desk first.

Needed Items: Please bring items that your child will need including, for younger children, formula/milk, spill-proof cup, diapers, wipes, extra clothing, and a special toy or book. A blanket or floor-mat for rest time would also be appropriate. Your child's name must be labeled on all of his/her items. A snack is provided in the morning and afternoon.
