#### Serious Illnesses

From **Jeff Clark** (1985), "You may already know this, but **Jim Murrell** is in very grave physical trouble. His heart is literally shutting down. Because of congenital problems that have worsened, his heart is only pumping about 1/4 of the blood it needs to, and the muscle itself is shutting down. The doctors have told him that he must have a heart transplant, and soon. They have indicated that this is possible and that he

would be viewed as a priority. The catch, as always, is money. He has finally gotten on disability and off of the government insurance he was on - but is now told that there is a 24 month waiting period before they will pay for procedures! He is working furiously to try to get some government official to help him get an exception to this. If no exception is made, it will be a cash transaction. \$750,000.00 is the amount they have quoted. Sounds like (and is) a large sum. But if 1000 people raise \$750, it is done!!! Could you please help us help Jim? Any amount will help. I am certainly not asking any one individual or congregation to do it all, but if enough of us "pitch in," we can do this! Yes, he is spiritually ready. His soul is the most important thing, and it needs no "surgery" because he is a faithful child of God. However, tell that to his wife, Jennifer - and to his kids, Julianna and Cameron. The whole family has handled this in a tremendous way but they want him to live. Don't you? The doctor will go in and shave the back of the skull and work to get the spinal fluid flowing properly. She does have insurance but it will only pay 60%. The doctor she has is supposed to be the best in this region at this, so we paid more to have him do the surgery. There will be an estimated cost of \$18,000 initially after surgery. I am

sure there will be more doctor bills to come with therapy and so forth. She also will lose her income for a couple of months, and we will make sure her insurance stays active. Mission Work
Eugene Jenkins (1980) writes,

"Eugene and Luvenia Jenkins continue their work CAMPAIGNS FOR CHRIST THROUGH WORLD MISSIONS. Luvenia speaks in a Ladies' Day in Bell, Missouri on March 27th, after which we will attend the Memphis School of Preaching Lectureship. In April we will be in Trinidad-Tobago, with Luvenia doing a Ladies' Day, and I will present a Church Growth Seminar, and then hold a Gospel Meeting. If time allows, we will then go to Grand Cayman to continue efforts in assisting the establishment of a new congregation in East End. In late May I will lead a team of twenty brethren on our annual Gospel Campaign to Jamaica. Luvenia and I will remain on the island for a couple of weeks to do follow up work. If plans come together, we will return to Grand Cayman for three months, beginning in August. There is a continual need for supporters. We will be glad to speak to you about our work."

Jeff Brown (2003) writes concerning the Buenos Aires, Costa Rica Campaign on Jan. 18-29, 2010. "On Monday, Brent Arnold and I traveled to San Jose, Costa Rica, and there we were joined by brethren Mark Bass, and Phil Grear, both of Columbus, OH. On Tuesday we traveled to Buenos Aires to begin a campaign there. The church has been in Buenos Aires for about eight months. The campaign began on Wednesday. Joining us there were approximately 15 congregations from various locations in Costa Rica and brethren from Panama, Nicaragua, and seven others from the states. The local congregation had set up many studies before our arrival there. The campaign went from Wednesday to Wednesday. During the campaign, eleven people obeyed the gospel. Two were restored. There are many ongoing Bible studies still taking place. When we arrived in Buenos Aires the congregation consisted of fifteen members and about ten children. At the end of the campaign, there were twenty-six members and about twenty children. Keep this work in your prayers. Plans are being made for next year's campaign in Heredia."

Howell Ferguson (84) writes, "You might be able to say that the 2010 year will be a "transition" year for my work in the Bear Valley Bible Institute of Denver extension program. The major difference in looking at our plans for 2010 and previous years is the less number of visits we'll be making. However, the length of time spent in the fewer trips will be quite different. The first trip Mary and I will make will be three months in Ukraine. Our travel plans are to leave the 4th of March and return the 3rd of June. This will enable us to remain in Ukraine the maximum amount of time without having to get a visa and will allow us to be there for graduation. There will be a number of primary objectives (not necessarily in order). First, I'll be teaching two 1- week short courses. The first course will be on Personal Evangelism, and the second course will be on the book of Job. The second objective will be to teach and implement, in a very practical way, the lessons on personal evangelism with the Central church which meets in the BVBIU facilities. ...A third objective will be to study consistently with a private Russian tutor. The last major objective will be to assist Terry Harmon in the operations of BVBIU. Once we return from Ukraine in early June, I plan to visit and give reports to churches during the summer months . . . Immediately afterwards, Mary and will be back to Ukraine in time for orientation and the opening day of class of BVBIU in Gorlovka. The duration of our stay there is indefinite at this time; but when we leave, we will fly directly to Tanzania (Chimala-MM) to remain there until near the end of November [Please pray for the sick, bereaved, and faithful laborers in the field.]
