From **Lee Davis (85):** "We here at the North Cobb congregation in Kennesaw, Georgia, had a wonderful World Missions Weekend on the 10th and 11th of July. Brother Billy Bland did an outstanding job in raising the awareness of brethren about world missions and to outline and describe the great work that is done through the Far East World Evangelism program that is overseen by the good Coldwater church. It was an exciting weekend. It would be great if this program could be hosted in every faithful congregation in the brotherhood."

From **David Lemmons (94 - 3rd yr):** "After 12 years with the North Marshall church of Christ near Calvert City, KY, I have moved to work with the brethren at the Dublin church of Christ in Dublin, GA. We are on I-16 between Macon and Savannah in middle Georgia. This is the church where brethren Jerry Martin and Eugene Jenkins have labored in time past. We are now about seven months into this new work and enjoying it a great deal. We have a small Hispanic work going here. We are helping to support brother Rick Owens at MSOP....In addition, I have been able (with the help of several brethren and two churches) to replace a motorcycle that was destroyed in a wreck on the island of Sulawesi in Indonesia. We also covered his medical expenses. Brother Mathias Posilambi was on his way to study with one of his prospects in the city of Kendari (using FISHERS OF MEN), when a fellow rider who was intoxicated slammed into him. Brother Mathias was knocked unconscious for a brief time. He has now fully recovered and is

continuing his work of spreading the saving message in Kendari."

From **Michael Hughes ('76):** "...19th trip to India, occurring July 22 - August 7. The usual work of preaching and teaching with associated acts of benevolence, including medical clinics for the poor and one for a leper colony (most of the people in this leper colony have been converted to Christ). This trip is additionally highlighted by the dedication of the boys' campus of the new Fleming Tarpidu Institute in Bikkavolu, Andhra Pradesh. The Institute is a specialized children's home of purpose and vision and has been in the planning for quite some time. Accompanied on this trip by David Nance ('80), his second time to India, and also Joshua Richardson ('08), making his first trip to India. Others who are not graduates of the school will be on this missionary journey as well. Part of the trip will also have the company of a brother from the congregation where Riley Nelson ('87) preaches. Though not a part of this trip, brother Randy Vaughn ('79) is connected with this India work also. We are in the process of putting a new steel roof over the building's existing rock and tar roof (which leaks every time it rains). We do not have a baptistry yet. Our plan is to build an addition in the near future which will not only supply that need, but also give us an area to use as both classroom space and a fellowship hall. At our first meeting as a congregation we had twenty-two people present. This past Sunday worship included thirty souls. We had two baptisms last year (which were accomplished in a member's swimming pool)"

I received this back on June 2nd **from Danny Butler (90):** "We have been informed that the result of Wanda's recent CT scan showed NO ABNORMALITIES. Her family doctor will begin to monitor her condition. She is doing well and returning to her old self slowly. It will take a while for the medicine to be regulated. From **Dustin Forthun (99):** "On June 1, I began a new work as the pulpit preacher for the Garden City church of Christ in Garden City, Michigan. Garden City is a small community on the west side of Detroit. The congregation has a solid reputation in this area and is under the oversight of two capable elders. We are involved in many good works here, including our annual Michigan Bible Lectureship (conducted each August) which is available for viewing online. Garden City

continues to be a strong supporter of MSOP, and I am proud to join several other alumni in doing the Lord's work in this area."

From Peter Chinn (06): Greetings to you from sunny Singapore. Upon graduating from MSOP in 2006, I taught for 6 months there before leaving to begin work as a full time instructor and Dean of Academics at Four Seas College in Singapore. Four Seas College of Bible & Missions held its 1st Annual Four Seas Lectureship, on the theme 'Church Growth', from June 1-5, 2008 (Sunday through Thursday). A total of 140 members attended the 5 day lectures. These lectures were conducted at the Jurong church building, Singapore. The Lord blessed us with a wonderful time of fellowship with brethren from more than 20 congregations from the United States, China, Taiwan, India, Nepal, Australia, Malaysia and Singapore. Twenty-six excellent lessons were presented on "Church Growth" including 4 daily classes especially for the ladies. Field reports on mission work and growth of churches were presented by those laboring in Australia, Russia, India, Nepal, Malaysia and Singapore. Included in the daily program was the "Question & Answer Forum" where many Bible questions were raised and answered by a panel of two speakers. The average daily attendance during the lectureship was about 95. Among those on the panel of speakers were brethren Billy Bland (Class of 1977), Lennie Reagan (Class of 1995), Gary Young (Class of 1990), Philip Vanwinkle (Class of 2005), Paul Praschnik (Class of 2006), Peter Chin (Class of 2006), Chris Kramer (Class of 2009). Brethren Billy Bland and Lennie Reagan each did a wonderful job in preaching during the evening Gospel Meeting. Sermons on the theme of "The Church" were delivered each night that saw an average attendance of about 120 with the highest attendance at 140

on Wednesday night. Many visitors attended and some for the first time at the Jurong church building. Brethren from churches in Malaysia (Ipoh, Kuala Lumpur, Cheras, Damansara Utama, Subang Jaya, Klang, Melaka, Johor Bahru) and Singapore (Jurong, Lim Ah Pin Rd.) came to support the meeting each night. We were thrilled that one member rededicated herself, one was restored after having left the church for many years, and another obeyed the gospel on the last evening. We praise God for these responses . . . Your labor of love in producing the newsletter is appreciated. It is a wonderful way to be updated on the work and well-being of MSOP graduates through the newsletter.”

And lastly from the editor, **Mike McDaniel (85)**: I have had a very busy summer with the work of the *A Bible Answer* television program since the departure of Dustin Forthun and Rick Lawson from the state of Tennessee within a few days of one another. However, a deacon at Gardner in Martin volunteered to take over the literature work which Rick had been doing. Also, a deacon at Phillips Street in Dyersburg has taken over the financial aspects of the work which Dustin has been handling. *A Bible Answer* continues to impact portions of five states through air time on Fox, CW., TCT, and

Lion’s Club stations as well as over the internet. Many thanks to many of our alumni in the area who serve as panelists in answering viewer’s questions. We have just gotten caught up with our internet archives. Please go to www.oabs.org and click on the *A Bible Answer* link to go to our web page. There you will find our archives from 2004 until the present and will be able to watch the video through Windows Media Player. You can also find Audio downloads for WMA players for those of you who like to listen while walking for exercise. I have served as an instructor for the Online Academy of Biblical Studies since 2002. Brethren Larry Powers (88) and Lee Davis (85) also serve as instructors. We are now registering students at www.oabs.org. This is a four year Saturday school for anyone with a zeal for God’s Word. Please inform your members about it and ask them to investigate our curriculum. I teach in front of a camera and the feed is streamed live over the internet. There is a twenty second delay between my spoken word, and its being heard by my students around the world. They can then ask me questions by means of a chat-room. We use special class software which provides links to upload and download resources, assignments, research papers, and exams. The Forum feature allows me to send out e-mails to all students automatically. They are also told when I have given them a grade. This technology is phenomenal, and I really enjoy teaching with it. I teach second year students Hebrews from January through May and New Testament Church from August through December. Fall classes begin August 2nd.

It is definitely encouraging to read of what God is doing through our alumni. As you seek to do His will, may He richly bless you in every good word and work.

2008 MSOP ALUMNI BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Among our old business: the motion was made and approved to amend The Constitution and Bylaws of the Alumni of the Memphis School of Preaching Article VII Terms of Office, Section 1. It has been amended to read: "The president, and vice president shall serve for two years and may be re-elected for only one additional term."

It was decided to put portions of brother Hearn's unfinished autobiography on the MSOP web site.

The motion was made and approved to present the MSOP secretaries with a \$50.00 gift card from the Cracker Barrel Restaurant. The gift cards were presented at the Alumni dinner.

The motion was made and approved to give \$1,000.00 from the Alumni fund to the building fund.

Motions were made and approved to select brother Jim Crowe (elder at Forest Hill) and brother Tom Holland (distinguished preacher of the gospel) as Honorary Alumni of the Memphis School of Preaching.

The motion was made and approved to elect Michael McDaniel to another term as president of the Memphis School of Preaching Alumni Association.

The motion was made and approved to give a copy of brother Hearn's sermon book and a copy of *Rejoice & Weep* to each MSOP student.

Our meeting began around noon on Tuesday of the lectureship and adjourned at 1:15 P.M. Thirty-two alumni were present for this meeting. This was an excellent number, and we were grateful for a very good and productive board meeting.

MSOP APARTMENT DEBT CONTINUES TO DWINDLE

Brother Liddell has informed me that the amount of debt left on the apartments now stands at around **\$440,000**. That is down from around \$800,000 at lectureship time. Obviously, this is a cause of rejoicing when you consider the fact that we started with an amount of **\$3.5 million dollars**. Brethren, the amount is dwindling. We must keep working to see this amount decrease and decrease and decrease until it disappears into nothingness.

During the entirety of my first term as

President of the Alumni Association, we have been working on the elimination of this debt. We produced a video in 2006 and yet another in 2007 to send out to interested individuals along with letters. Informational dinners have been conducted around the country. Alumni have worked hard and their efforts are greatly appreciated.

Let us all re-double our efforts in the last half of 2008 to make this debt disappear!
