Several years ago, brother Barry Grider asked me to compile a top ten list of my favorite books for his homiletics class. On that list is brother Merideth's outstanding commentary on Galatians. It was first published in 1981. I purchased my copy in 1985, the year I graduated from MSOP. It has been a treasured volume in my library ever since.

For a number of years this book has been out of print. However, on February 20<sup>th</sup>, an email was sent from Paul Merideth (his son) to Ted Thrasher (Director of the Online Academy Of Biblical Studies). It was then forwarded to all faculty members including myself. It read as follows: "In 1981 my dad, J. Noel Merideth, published his commentary on the New Testament book of Galatians. It has been out of print and unavailable for many years. However, I am now able to make it digitally available as a pdf document to any who would like it. May it be a blessing to you in your study of God's word."

# Have You Paid Your Dues For 2014?



Training Servants Now—And For The Time To Come

At Memphis School Of Preaching

June 21-June 27, 2014

Theme: "Make Me A Servant"

What? This is a week of specialized training for young men (ages 13-19) and young ladies (ages 13-19) who want to learn more about becoming better servants for God. There will be some joint chapel services, activities, and devotionals, but the boys and the girls will be in separate classes during the day. These daily classes will include faith-building teaching on Christian Evidences, holiness and moral purity, as well as practical instruction on how to be an effective servant.

Young Men will receive training in such areas as:

• How to lead singing

• Presiding over the distribution of the Lord's Supper

- Leading public prayer
- Effective public reading of Scripture

• Preparation of sermons and the proclamation of God's Word in preaching. This instruction will include messages on how to study the Bible, how to develop an outline, how to introduce and conclude a sermon, etc., etc., etc.

• Preparing To Become An Elder In The Lord's Church

• Preparing To Become A Deacon In The Lord's Church

Young Ladies will receive training in such areas as:

• Leading other young ladies in singing at a girls' devo, or Ladies Day program, etc.

• Preparing the Lord's Supper (Baking unleavened bread, etc.) for worship

• Leading a prayer in a girls' devotional or at

a Ladies Day Program, etc.

• Reading Scripture in a girls' devotional or at a Ladies Day Program, etc.

• How to prepare and deliver a message to a Bible class, or girls' devotional, or a Ladies' class at a lectureship, or Ladies' day program.

• The kind of women we need in the Lord's Church

To prepare them in the work of the church, we will provide training in the following areas:

• How To Conduct A Home Bible Study

• Some Do's and Don'ts For Making Hospital Visits

- Remembering Widows and Orphans
- How To Comfort Those Who Are Grieving
- Preparing A Church Bulletin/Newsletter
- Computer Training (Making PowerPoint presentations, etc.).
- How To Use The Library For Research

**Who?** This special week of training is open to young men (ages 13-19), and young women (ages 13-19) who submit and receive approval of their applications, recommendation forms, and medical release forms. We would love to accommodate every request to attend, but because of limited housing, the logistics of giving proper attention to each student, and finding time for sermons/speeches to be presented, we will accept applications until we have run out of housing space. Applications will be processed on a first come, first serve basis, so do not delay. Applications and forms must be received and approved by June 6th, 2014.

When? June 21st-June 27th, 2014

• Campers will arrive on Saturday afternoon, June 21st, 2014. Check-in begins at 3 p.m.

• Upon check-in, students will be assigned roommates. They will also meet the adult supervisor who will be staying with them in the available student apartments located on the campus of MSOP, or they will meet the Christian family in whose home they will be staying during FOUNDATIONS. Of course, the boys and girls will be staying in separate buildings/homes, and will be under adult supervision in these dwellings.

• After a period of orientation, there will be a cookout for the campers on Saturday at approximately 4:30-5 p.m., followed by games and mixers.

• An evening devotional will conclude Saturday's activities and the campers will go to their respective apartments/homes to retire for the evening. • All campers will attend at Forest Hill church of Christ for Sunday services.

• The camp will continue through Friday evening, and will officially close with a banquet. Campers will leave after the banquet. Those with great distances to travel may stay Friday evening and check out by no later than 10:00 a.m. on Saturday.

**Cost?** The camp is free. Meals will be provided by a number of generous congregations and brethren in the Memphis area. As noted above, housing is also free. The students will stay in designated apartments on the MSOP campus, (some of which are unoccupied during the summer break), or they will stay in the homes of Christians in the area. You will need some spending money for the recreational activities mentioned above.
