

Syllabus on Studies in Romans

Required reading: (1) Students enrolled for ‘Certificate seekers’ or ‘Diploma seekers’ must read through the book of Romans outside of class room hours; (2) Any select commentary approved by instructor.

Additional work: Students enrolled in ‘Certificate’ and/or ‘Diploma’ classes must write a 6-10 page research paper on some subject pertinent to the study of Romans. This paper is required to have at least four source references. It must meet the guidelines of the MLA Handbook for Writers. A copy of those guidelines is available upon request from the instructor.

Focus and goal of the class: This class is designed to examine not only the text of Romans, but to focus on points of attack from the critics and enemies of the text. Emphasis will be given to the following subjects:

- (1) Justification by obedient faith
- (2) The role of baptism in God’s system of justification
- (3) The work of the Holy Spirit in justification
- (4) The resurrection
- (5) Propitiation

Tests: There will be two tests. One of these will be at mid-term, the second at the close of the course. Each test will cover the material covered between the beginning of the class or the beginning of the second half of the course. All ‘Certificate’ and/or ‘Diploma’ seekers are required to take this test and achieve at least a C- in the class to receive the certificate and/or diploma offered.

Online students who are seeking either the ‘Diploma’ or ‘Certificate’ must contact the instructor in order to assure proper credit be given upon completion of the class.
